E. camaldulensis "River Red Gum" summer with a good water supply can attain a height of 12-15 m in a few years
Eucalyptus flowers in most years from late spring to mid-summer (July to February according to Brooker and Kleinig, 1999, December to February according to Boland, 1984).
Flowering intensity is variable and unpredictable from year to year. About 45% of flowers fail to mature (Dexter, 1978).

Eucalyptus gardneri

Acacia beckleri

Acacia beckleri will form an attractive rounded shrub 2 metres high in 3 to 4 years. It begins flowering in early **May and continues through until late July**. This makes it a particularly useful plant, providing bright yellow flowers at a dull, cold time of the year.

Eucalyptus ficifolia

Acacia dealbata

The pale to bright yellow flower clusters are globular in shape and are produced terminally or in the leaf axils in **late winter to mid-spring**

E. ficifolia Red flowering gum C,W Med Med **Dec-Jan** Ornamental WA

E. leucoxylon Yellow gum W Med Low **Apr-Jun**

E. microcarpa Western grey box W Med Med **Autumn**

E. melliodora Yellow box T,W High Nil **Summer** Quality honey. Flowers in winter in warmer areas.

E. camaldulensis River red gum T,W High High **Summer** Salt tolerant

E. cinerea Argyle apple T Low Med **Oct-Nov**
